NUCALA is an add-on, prescription maintenance treatment for patients 6 and older with severe eosinophilic asthma. NUCALA is not used to treat sudden breathing problems.

STUDIES OF PEOPLE WITH SEVERE ASTHMA SHOWED THAT -8 OUT OF 10 HAD HIGH EOSINOPHIL LEVELS*

Eosinophils are a **key source of asthma inflammation**. They are normal white blood cells that are part of your immune system. Too many of them may lead to inflammation in your lungs, which can cause severe asthma attacks.

*Based off 2 studies that looked at medical records of patients with severe asthma and found that 74% and 84% had either high eosinophil levels or were on medication to lower eosinophil levels, or had characteristics of elevated eosinophil levels.

NUCALA GETS TO A KEY SOURCE.

NUCALA treats more than your symptoms of your severe asthma; this may help you improve asthma control and reduce your oral steroid use.

SO, WHAT'S NEXT FOR YOU?

Ask a specialist to measure your eosinophil levels through simple blood testing. It could help determine if you have severe eosinophilic asthma—SEA.


Important Safety Information (cont'd)

NUCALA can cause serious side effects, including:

- **allergic (hypersensitivity) reactions, including anaphylaxis.** Serious allergic reactions can happen after you get your NUCALA injection. Allergic reactions can sometimes happen hours or days after you get a dose of NUCALA. Tell your healthcare provider or get emergency help right away if you have any of the following symptoms of an allergic reaction: swelling of your face, mouth, and tongue; breathing problems; fainting, dizziness, feeling lightheaded (low blood pressure); rash; hives.
- **Herpes zoster infections** that can cause shingles have happened in people who received NUCALA.

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SO, WHAT IS NUCALA EXACTLY?

IT'S A DIFFERENT KIND OF TREATMENT.



Not an inhaler. Not a steroid. It's a once-monthly* add-on injection for severe eosinophilic asthma. And, with the easy-to-use Autoinjector,† you can take your injection without leaving the house.

At home not for you? No problem. You can get your NUCALA injections at your specialist's office every 4 weeks.

Just know, it's important to monitor for serious allergic reactions after injection, either in your specialist's office or at home. Sometimes serious allergic reactions, including anaphylaxis, can occur hours or days after administration of NUCALA.

Important Safety Information (cont'd)

Before receiving NUCALA, tell your healthcare provider about all of your medical conditions, including if you:

- are taking oral or inhaled corticosteroid medicines. **Do not** stop taking your other asthma medicines, including your corticosteroid medicines, unless instructed by your healthcare provider because this may cause other symptoms to come back.
- have a parasitic (helminth) infection.
- are pregnant or plan to become pregnant. It is not known if NUCALA may harm your unborn baby.

Important Safety Information (cont'd)

Before receiving NUCALA, tell your healthcare provider about all of your medical conditions, including if you (cont'd):

- are breastfeeding or plan to breastfeed. You and your healthcare provider should decide if you will use NUCALA and breastfeed. You should not do both without talking with your healthcare provider first.
- are taking prescription and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements.

The most common side effects of NUCALA include: headache, injection site reactions (pain, redness, swelling, or a burning feeling at the injection site), back pain, and tiredness (fatigue).
